

Progress Highlights





1. Feed 44 animals daily and provide shelter.

- 2. Hay Storage & Garage: added 2,000 square feet of roof.
- 3. Four student workers: clean bowls, troughs, and spaces weekly.
- 4. Tiger: homeless cate getting food and shelter in orchard barn.
- 5. Panther: feral, is eating at our orchard barn.
- 6. Recycled a thousands of pounds of old metal gutters and rusted fence wire.
- 7. We will host soon two university classes focused on Animal Care, Environment, Sustainability.
- 8. We invited The Old Guard of the US Army at Arlington National Cemetery to send a cap walker to lead our riderless horse in the Veterans Day Parade November 11. This would be the first time a cap walker from Arlington has led a cap horse retired from Arlington in Birmingham, the oldest Veterans Day Parade in America. Hank (Alabama nickname Tank) walked in the parade last year.
- 9. The Governor's Committee developing updated course of study standards for social studies adopted our proposal to add teaching national history of Veterans Day starting in Alabama. Next year, if standards are approved, the focus will shift to resources to recommend to teachers. This milestone is significant because the best way for all Alabama citizens to know Veterans Day started in Alabama is to make teaching that history an annual standard in classes and events.
- 10. IRS nonprofit section (exempt organizations) approved our request to amend our legal name to Compassion Ranch and Institute. This will make it easier for animal lovers to find us online and donate to help the animals. We are on PayPal and Venmo with plans to add more.

FYI: our nonprofit started 30+ years ago as the Personal Leadership Association, teaching planning for life and personal leadership. After the September 11 attacks on America in 2001, we added Patriotism in Action and amended the IRS name to Life Leaders America aka Life Leaders Institute. We started helping Veterans Day, published two books, and started the riderless horse tradition in the Birmingham parade, plus adopted more animals. Compassion Ranch is our most popular program – 90+% of donations seek to help animals and students.



Estimated Expenses Monthly--FYI

Trustee/director for animals, land, programs	\$0	Likely need to pay the next generation
Food: hay, feed pellets, supplements	\$1500	
Vet exams, treatments, surgery, medicines	\$200-500	vet service per animal range \$50-1500
Students cleaning animal and common areas	\$1,000	4-6 students one afternoon / week
Shelter/fence building, repair, maintenance	\$400-1000	
Equipment: fuel, oil, repair, maintenance	\$200-400	load hay/feed/lumber, pasture care
Vet exams, treatments, surgery, medicines Students cleaning animal and common areas Shelter/fence building, repair, maintenance	\$1,000 \$400-1000	4-6 students one afternoon / week

Animals Needs Now

Snow needs spay surgery. Est. \$100.
Beau needs 6 month check up to finish treating heart worms. \$50-150.
Tiger (homeless cat) needs neuter surgery, test for worms, food daily. \$100-150
Panther (feral cat) need TNR spay surgery, treatments for worms. \$100-150.
Horses, ponies, donkeys, pig, goat need hoofs trimmed more often. Farrier. \$250
Horses and farm animals need hay now and stored to feed winter\$3000.

	Barefield Flagpole & Patriotism in Action Garden: 7 signs, flags, solar lights.
	Student worker stipends—clean troughs/bowls for animals, prep for events, develop work ethic. Pavilion with covered arena for programs with students and horses, hay storage, solar panels
	Lime and fertilizer to improve soil for pasture grass to increase food for horses

	Animal Sponsorship of Food and Care
In	stead of buy and care for your own horse, sponsor and visit one of ours – we provide food, hay, water, shelter daily care and feeding, cleaning of animal areas, vet diagnosis and surgeries
	Horse: \$10/day (similar to a typical boarding fee for grass and water, though our animals also
	have shelter – we also provide hay, supplemental feed, medicine, vet care, surgeries if needed)
	Pony or donkey: \$5/day.
	Dog, cat, goat, pig: \$1 / day or \$30 recurring monthly.
	Help more caregivers with spay and neuter surgeries/vet care (est. \$100, sometimes only \$50).
	Equipment Needed to Work for Animals Better and Faster
	Horse trailer painted and serviced before the Veterans Day Parade.
	Truck for transporting horses to vet care, parade, events(keep our old truck on the farm).
	Mini-ex for digging and deepening watering holes (small ponds) and prompt, respectful burials.
	Hay wagon for students and adults to take safe tours of land and animals pulled by tractor
	Publications to Inspire Students and Support Patriots
	<i>Riderless Horse</i> cards: give to students, teachers, guests, example of honoring veterans
	Pledge of Allegiance cards: for students and teachers to use, for us to hand out.
	National Veterans Day Started in Alabama cards for teachers & veteran program leaders.
