# **Progress Highlights**

- 1. Tiger: homeless cat fed at orchard got neuter surgery and joined our "cat porch."
- 2. Beau: 6-month checkup for heart worms—improved; 6 more months.
- 3. Snow: spay surgery, gained from  $\frac{1}{2}$  pound to almost 5 pounds.
- 4. Four student workers: clean bowls, troughs, and spaces weekly.
- 5. Roof of 2,000 square feet built for hay and tractor protection; added corral gates.
- 6. Recycled 1120 pounds of metal. \$78 earned (paid for roll of hay and bag of food).
- 7. Road covering pipe installed from hangar to pasture with pipe for creek water flow.
- IRS and State of Alabama approved name change to Compassion Ranch and Institute.
- 9. Preparing for 2 classes from the University of Montevallo hosted here. Volunteers welcome.
- 10. Preparing for the riderless horse in America's first Veterans Day Parade (Birmingham1947). Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Kelly Ingram Post will host us to park our truck and trailer to groom and tack Hank to serve as the caparisoned (riderless) horse in the parade.

# Animal Shelters, Facilities, and Services Needed

☐ Hay: 20 horses and farm animals need hay now and stored to feed winter. □ Student volunteers to groom animals (experience optional though must be reliable). ☐ Student stipends—clean troughs/bowls, litter boxes and stalls, prep for events. ☐ Hangar fence to protect hay and use for student events. □ Cat walks in 3 barns so homeless cats can climb above horses to eat and sleep. ☐ Horse trailer service and signs before riderless horse in Veterans Day Parade. Farrier: horses, ponies, donkeys, pig, goat need hoofs trimmed more often. □ Barefield Flagpole & Patriotism in Action Garden: 7 signs, name sign, flags, solar lights. Wheelchair ramp to the porch and front door of the farmhouse. ☐ Fans and heaters for Bryant Barn. Animal Sponsorship of Food and Care *Instead of buy and care for your own horse, you can sponsor and visit one of ours.* ☐ Horse: \$10/day (similar to a typical boarding fee--we also provide vet care, surgeries if needed...) □ Pony or donkey: \$5/day for food, shelter, vet care.... Dog, cat, goat, pig: \$1 / day or \$30 recurring monthly. Help more caregivers with spay and neuter surgeries/vet care (est. \$100, if grants, some \$50). Sponsor a student worker: \$40-60 / week. Equipment Needed to Work for Animals Better and Faster Mini-ex for digging and deepening watering holes (small ponds) and prompt, respectful burials. Truck to transport horses to vet care, parade, events, feed errands...(keep old truck on the farm). Sponsor Programs for Students, Families, Classes □ 1, 2, or 4 hour experiences designed to teach, inspire, create smiles for children, students, parents. School/university class visit with program to help with academic and student development. Students interested in animal care professions — community service, school project, internship. Publications to Inspire Students and Support Patriots Riderless Horse cards: give to students, teachers, guests, example of honoring veterans. \$100. *Pledge of Allegiance* cards: for students and teachers to use, for us to hand out. \$100.
