Triple D Ranch & Farm services & expenses for animals & programs:

- ☆ Fed and watered 44 animals (food purchased with donations).
- ☆ Repaired tractors and trucks: flat tire, headlights, wiper, fuel line.
- ☆ Welded cracked auger to dig more fence post holes.
- ☆ Reused or recycled 20 boxes of goods increasing space in hangar.
- ☆ Recycled 20+ plastic feed bags full of other used plastic.
- ☆ Repurposed 6 wired security cameras to neighbor needing them and changing ours to solar.
- ☆ Solar security camera and lights installed at entrance + 12 more in corrals and pastures.
- ☆ Corral at hangar for horses, students, and hay: added 2 gates, more fence in progress.

Food: hay, feed pellets, supplements	\$1500	Average 10,000 pounds per mo.
Vet exams, treatments, surgery, medicines	\$200-500	Range of \$50-1500
Students cleaning animal and common areas	\$1,000	4-5 students 4-5 hours / week
Shelter/fence building, repair	\$500-1000	Lumber, fence wire, roofing
Equipment: fuel, oil, repair, maintenance	\$500-1000	Move hay, mow pasture, lifting

Compassion Courage Caling

Needed: Animal Shelters, Facilities, and Services

- Groomers of horses or pony and donkeys November 9, 1-2, 2-3, 3-4.
- Farrier by Nov 9 to help trim Hank and other horses plus a pony.
- Hay: 20 horses and farm animals need hay now and stored to feed winter \$500+/month.
- Student stipend sponsor: working, developing work ethic, earning--\$150-250/month each.
- Carpenter: repair stall gate...build pet pen roof, fence...wheelchair ramp to the farmhouse porch.
- Cat walks in Bryant Barn above horses for homeless cats to eat and sleep with shelter.
- Barefield Flagpole & Patriotism in Action Garden: 7 signs, name sign, flags, solar lights.

Needed: Animal Sponsorship of Food and Care

Instead of buy and care for your own horse, you can sponsor, enjoy, and help one of ours.

- ☐ Horse: \$10/day (similar to a boarding fee--we provide vet care, surgeries if needed...)
- □ Pony or donkey: \$5/day for food, shelter, vet care....
- Dog, cat, goat, pig: \$1 / day or \$30 recurring monthly...
- ☐ Help more caregivers with spay and neuter surgeries

Needed: Equipment to Work Better and Faster

- Horse trailer service before riderless horse in Veterans Day Parade November 11.
- Horse trailer 16-20' with 2 stalls and tack/supply room to transport 2 large horses by 2025.
- Mini-excavator for digging watering holes & small ponds plus prompt caring burials.
- Truck to transport horses to vet care, parade, events, feed errands...(keep old truck on the farm).

Sponsor Programs for Families, Students, Classes

- 1, 2, or 4 hour...experiences designed to teach, inspire, create smiles.
- School/university class: visit with program to help with academic credit & student development.
- Projects to help with animals, orchards/farm, solar...and earn community service credit.
- Students interested in animal care professions: classes, internship....
